Has your club ever felt out of place in your division? Do you feel you would connect better

with the clubs in a neighboring division that may be closer? Kiwanis recognizes that communities change over time, which may result in better synergy among clubs. Therefore, the bylaws mandate that the District formally evaluate the make-up of the Divisions every four years. Most of the time, no changes are made. However, redivisioning could lead to improvements by moving a club from one division to another; splitting a division in two; or combining neighboring divisions into one.


Tampa
